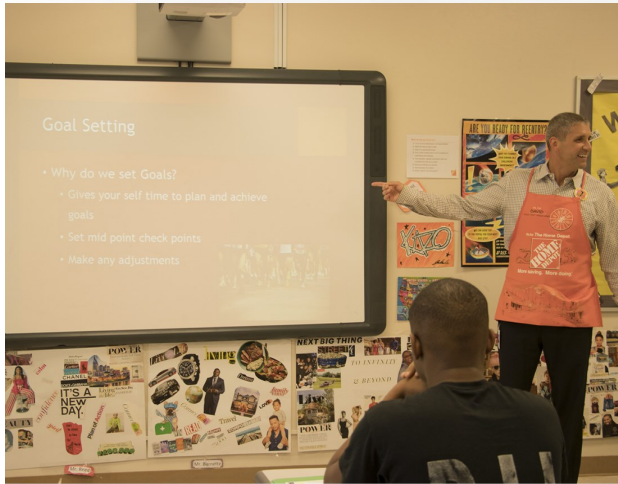

All DJJ internships offer academic credit without compensation.

# **HOW DO I BECOME A VOLUNTEER OR INTERN?**
