DJJ offers a one-time Military Salary Increase Incentive to current/ former military service members, on eligible job titles, who have served on active duty. The Character of Service Discharge must have been under Honorable conditions. The one-time incentive will be based upon the current number of active duty years served.

Military Salary Increase Incentive Amounts:

- 2.5% for 1 year of active duty service
- 5% for 2 years of active duty service
- 7.5% for 3 years of active duty service
- 10% for 4+ years of active duty service
