Child Find

Child Find is a process designed to identify, locate, and evaluate individuals from birth to 21 years of age who are suspected of, or have a disability or developmental delay that may result in a need for special education and related services.

The Department of Juvenile System School has Child Find responsibility for all students within its jurisdiction suspected of having disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disabilities. We provide child find for all students enrolled in DJJ through Multi-tiered System of Supports (MTSS).
