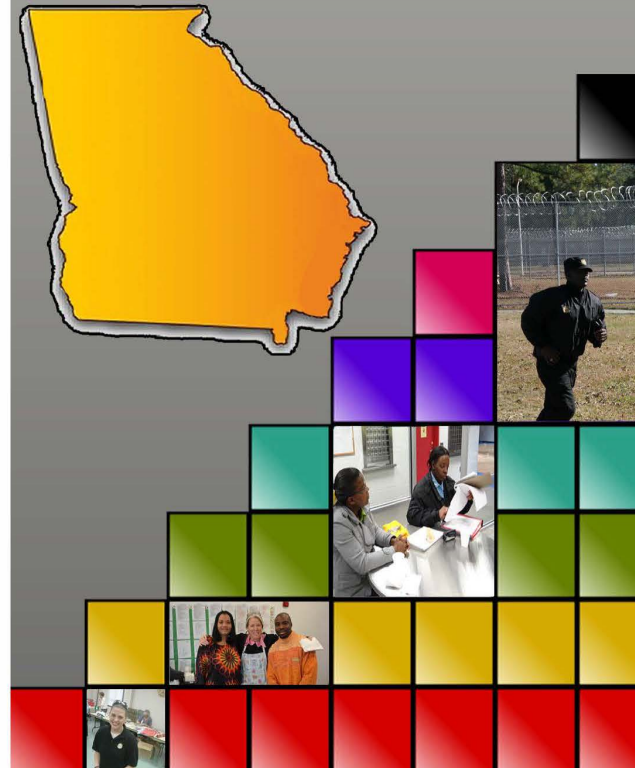
USE YOUR GI BILL FOR OJT

You can use your GI Bill benefits in our on-the-job training and apprenticeship programs.

During job training, a newly hired veteran, if eligible, can receive up to \$16,263 tax-free supplement income from the GI Bill during a two-year, experience-based training program. National Guardsmen and Reservists currently under a six-year contract may also be eligible.

The Georgia Department of Juvenile Justice is a multi-faceted agency that serves the state's youthful offenders up to age of 21. Each day at 26 facilities and 92 court services offices throughout the state, more than 4,000 DJJ employees work diligently to effect justice as well as redirect and shape the young lives in the agency's care. This enables youth to take responsibility for their delinquent conduct and become contributing members of society.

While holding youthful offenders accountable for their actions through probation supervision and secure detention, DJJ provides youth with a premium education and medical and psychological treatment, as well as specialized programs designed to equip them with the social, intellectual and emotional tools they will need as adults.



As Georgia's 181st school district, DJJ offers youth in our custody the opportunity to earn a high school diploma from a system accredited by both the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and the Correctional Education Association (CEA). Some 52,000 youth are served annually, including those who are placed on probation, sentenced to short-term incarceration, or committed to the Department's custody by Juvenile Courts.
