DJJ recruiters are authorized to interview qualified JCO candidates on-site. Applicants should come dressed for job interviews and bring resumes. All job seekers can click on www.djicareers.org for more information about career opportunities in juvenile corrections.

In order to progress smoothly through the interview process for Juvenile Corrections Officers, candidates for JCO positions should bring copies of the following:

- Completed State of Georgia application
- State issued ID - Valid Driver License
- Social Security Card
- Birth Certificate
- High School Diploma or GED
- DD214 Long Form with discharge indicated
- Naturalization Forms (if NON-US Citizen)
- If P.O.S.T. Certified, (Please bring two (2) forms of Gov. issued ID & P.O.S.T. Profile)

Candidates should bring Passing Test Scores as follows:

- Compass Scores (Reading 70 Writing 32)**
- SAT Scores (Verbal: 430 Math: 400) or ACT Scores (Verbal: 18 Math:16)**
- CPE Scores (Reading: 75 Math: 75 English 75)

**** Applicants with a 4-year degree from an accredited college are exempt from taking the Compass test or providing proof of acceptable ACT or SAT scores.**

Former military service members with Honorable Discharge should click on www.djicareers.org to learn about DJJ's one-time Military Salary Increase Incentive on eligible job titles at "DJJ Careers for Veterans".
