In order to move successfully through the interview process for Juvenile Corrections Officers, candidates must bring copies of the following:

- Compass Scores (Reading 70 Writing 32)**
- Valid Driver License
- Birth Certificate
- High School Diploma or GED
- DD214 Long Form with indicated discharge
- Naturalization Forms if NON-US Citizen
- If P.O.S.T. Certified, (Please bring two (2) forms of Gov. issued ID & P.O.S.T. Profile)

**** If the applicant has a 4-year degree from an accredited college they are exempt from having to take the Compass test or provide proof of acceptable ACT or SAT scores.**

DJJ recruiters are authorized to interview qualified candidates on-the-spot for new correctional officer opportunities. Job seekers with special skills and initiative should dress for success and bring their resumes to these job fairs.

These juvenile corrections positions require professional attitudes and performance. They're a major first step for starting a full time juvenile corrections career.

"Serious applicants should know we only want mature, responsible adult candidates who are interested in helping young offenders through their troubled life transitions," said Commissioner Avery Niles. "It takes especially motivated people to join our mission," Niles said.

Applicants who have served in the Armed Forces should also click on the section at www.djicareers.org about "DJJ Careers for Veterans" to learn more about DJJ's one-time Military Salary Increase Incentive on eligible job titles to current and former military service members, who have served on active duty. To be eligible, service members must have an Honorable Discharge. The one-time incentive is based upon the current number of active duty years served.
