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Department of Juvenile Justice Hiring Statewide DJJ Recruiters Taking Applications Across Georgia in July Dublin, Norcross, Sandersville, Hinesville, Americus

(STATEWIDE - GA) DJJ Commissioner Avery D. Niles announces the Department of Juvenile Justice is rolling out the agency's summer recruitment schedule to connect with eligible applicants searching for full time placement in juvenile corrections career positions.

"Our Human Resources Team has been on the road all summer and they're setting up the 'Help-Wanted' signs at career fairs all over Georgia," said Commissioner Avery Niles. "DJJ offers excellent career opportunities to responsible, mature civilian and veteran applicants looking for fulltime employment. We're an equal opportunity employer and the State of Georgia is an excellent career destination for returning veterans as well," Niles said.

Participation at juvenile corrections career fairs is free and with the exception of some military recruiting fairs, most events are open to the general public. Department of Juvenile Justice recruiters plan to attend at least five major job fairs in July.

DJJ recruiters will be hiring across Georgia in search of qualified candidates for a wide range of available corrections career opportunities; including Educators and Special Education Teachers, Registered Nurses and Physicians, Corrections and Transportation Officers, Social Workers, Probation and Parole Specialists, Security Emergency Response Teams, I-T Technicians, Food Service Providers and more.

“It takes professionals with special skills and initiative to work in juvenile corrections,” said Commissioner Niles. “There’s no doubt this is a demanding profession and it’s not suited to just anyone. It takes a special kind of person to join our mission and these career fairs help us find the high caliber talent and capable workforce we’re searching for.”

Commissioner Niles actively supports Governor Deal’s ‘Hire a Georgia Veteran’ initiative to help bolster the DJJ workforce with returning service men and women who bring valuable skillsets to the workplace and frequently adapt seamlessly into juvenile correctional careers.

DJJ offers a one-time ‘Military Salary Increase Incentive’ for eligible job titles to current and former military service members who have served on active duty. The one-time incentive is based upon the current number of active duty years served. For eligibility, service members must have an Honorable Discharge.
